CAG Successes



RELATIONSHIPS

- Personal relationships among members are invaluable
- Improved relationship between EPA and many member/stakeholder groups

PROCESS

- People increasingly comfortable to speak frankly and constructively at the meetings
- Meetings on task and focused
- Subgroups work well enable in-depth work
 - Economic development meetings spurred action
 - Technical group did detailed reviews of draft design
- Civility has greatly increased at meetings

CAG Successes (2)



INFORMATION AND EDUCATION

- Good information sharing vehicle
- Forum is a good way to examine issues
- Presentations: impressed with Trustees work, good capturing of issues/items for discussion

OTHER

- EPA staff patient, hardworking, honest, good community relations
- CAG members seem to agree on many issues
- Boat trip was good, want another

CAG Concerns & Challenges



INFLUENCE

- CAG's advisory role and limited power to influence GE and EPA.
- Concerned CAG community relations rather than community input
- Very limited interaction with GE

TRANSPARENCY AND RESPONSIVENESS

- EPA should be more straightforward and transparent with the CAG
- Some feel they are wasting their time ("treading water"): answers not available, missed opportunities, no progress

CAG Challenges (2)



MEDIA

- Press attention tends to encourage grandstanding, not conversation
- Occasional name calling: group's behavior more unpredictable when cameras are on

PROJECT

- Project delay
- Need to see substantive, active progress

OUTREACH

Low community awareness of the project

Ideas for the CAG



- Orientation for new members (face to face, with EPA and CBI)
- Keep subgroups active
- Have CAG members decide when CAG will meet or not: whether EPA has news or not
- Invite Alan Steinberg (EPA Region 2) again
- Reach out to new congressional leaders
- Want CAG meeting schedule in advance
- Change meeting locations sometimes. Have a meeting in Albany or south.
- Some time at each meeting to plan for the future benefits & economic development
